Recent government changes to planning Law allowed for the conversion of agricultural buildings to a dwelling house as permitted development outside off N.Y.M.N.P.A. <i>An “established agricultural unit” (which means agricultural land occupied as a unit for the proposed of agricultural on or before 20th March 2013 or for ten years before the date the proposed development will begin)</i> The Parish Council express concerns about the lack of plans and limited information accompanying this application from H.D.C. The Parish Council felt that this type of application could have been explained more clearly as it approved to meet the permitted development criteria. The Parish Council had no objected.</p>

Harker, The Bungalow, Stone Stoup Hill, Ingleby Greenhow Alteration and construction of single extension with balcony above and dormer windows. The Parish Council had received one comment from a neighbour, express concern that they maybe now over looked. The Parish Council had no objection.</p>
6	<p>PLANNING APPLICATION GRANTEDBY N.Y.M.N.P.A NYM/2015/0207/FL Battersby Junction Community Associated Land South West of The Railway Siding, Battersby Junction, change of use of land to community recreation space with associated play area and equipments. This had 9 conditions on. Director M B Bowes of B.J.C.A., asked if the Parish Council would write a letter in support to Biffa, as a grant application was to be submitted to them. This was agreed.</p>

Cllr H. Moorhouse informed the meeting that the cricket field water supply had mud in it. The Cricket Club had contacted Ingleby Estate about this. It was agreed for the Parish Clerk to also contacted Ingleby Estate to expressing concern at the lack of progress.</p> <p>11.9 Sewage Work Ingleby Greenhow</p> <p>Michael Charlton, Production Leader for Northumbrian Water, had been contacted about the netting structure on plant at Ingleby Greenhow. There is now a new Manager Bruce Walton, who would be sending the Parish Council an update on the structure.
