7 7.1	<p>FREEDOM CAMPING CLUB New Sheepfold Farm, Ingleby Greenhow A local resident has written to Rishi Sunak our MP regarding this application. A copy of the letter from NYMNPA, to the Freedom Camping Club was provided. The NYMNPA has forward the comments from NYCC Highways, Parish Council and Local Residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Highways have concerns in relation to the roads in the area would have to be negotiated by towing caravans on the possible route to the site in and around the Lamb Lane area. • Concern are the length of single track road between Greenhow Avenue and the application site which has no formal passing places along the route. There are narrow verges which would lead to lengthy reversing maneuvers should 2 vehicles traveling in opposite directions meet. • Other agricultural vehicles that will be using the road. • Local Residents have also objection to this application.

7.2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Parish Council has raised concerns about this application. It is still not clear if it is going to be 5 caravans/tents or shepherds huts. Shepherd huts would be less of an impact with traffic than cars pulling caravans. NYMNPA would be asked that for the next Western Forum meeting this type of application should go on the agenda. <p>FREEDOM CAMPING CLUB Demblin Easby The owner informed the Parish Council that they had received a letter dated 30th September, from the Freedom Camping Club. It stated that in principle the Freedom Camping Club had agreed to issues a certificate.</p>

NYCC Cllr H Moorhouse informed the meet that funding was there and work should start shortly.</p> <p>Slow sign on road near entrance to Baysdale off the Kildale Road Now completed</p> <p>High House Farm, Greenhow Bottom Defect reported 05/02/18 NYCC Cllr H Moorhouse informed the meet that funding was there and work should start shortly</p> <p>Old Battersby to to Junction of Marsh Lane/Lamb Lane Ingleby Greenhow C24 The road condition is in a very bad state. NYCC Highways Officer has been out and marked the road for structural repairs and them it will be resurfaced. Cllr T Sutcliffe has contacted NYCC Highways informing then that the section from the top of Church Bank to Lamb Lane the marking outs has been missed off. Also asked to look at the 40m from the bottom of Church Bank to the south entrance to St Andrew Church, which is in a very bad state. Ben Jackson had to do 1 minor repair on Coleson Bank. Cllr L Smith informed the meeting since the road has been repair there seems to be less 4×4 and motor bikes using the track.</p>

At a previous meeting the Parish Council were informed that the BT line would go underground as the NYMNPA do not like poles. The Parish Council and Residents felt let down as no consultation has be taken has to what is going to happen. It was agreed that the Chairman, Cllr L Smith and NYCC Cllr H Moorhouse would contact NYNET to see what is going to happen and arrange an urgent meeting with them. A Resident asked would the super fast broadband be going up Greenhow the Parish Council were unable to answer their request.
