Letter received from Ingleby Greenhow and Easby Village Hall Treasurer The Committee had installed LED system in the hall at a cost of £2240, they have secured a grant of £2000 from the Jack Brunton Trust and were requesting for a grant of £240 from the Parish Council.

Unfortunately, the Council was not quorum so this would go to the March meeting.

Cllr E Martin who is the chair of the hall informed the Council that they were applying for grants to update the hall.

Cllr T Sutcliffe ask could the village hall committee put a list together of what needed to be done to the hall and bring this to the Council.

Cllr T Sutcliffe stated relating to the village hall the requirement each year the a copy of the account sent to the Parish Council (and any other parish with in the area of benefit or Chairman of the parish meeting) is set out as an obligation in the village hall trust deed (para 18).

that the Village Hall accounts should be presented to the Parish Council each year, as this is stated in the hall constitution.

Cllr E Martin informed the Council that the yearend accounts do go up in the hall.

The Parish Council approved a grant under section 137 to At Andrew Church of £150 for the upkeep of the ground and footpath in the church yard.
