- 7.1 Unfortunately Cllr R. Wills was unable to attend the meeting, so the Parish Clerk gave an update on progress with the development of the website. To date the following items have been added: past minutes; the risk management policy; the code of conduct; and standing orders. Links to other useful websites have also been added as have some photos of work that the Parish Council has undertaken.
- 7.2 The Council discussed the addition of other material of local interest such as local walks (action to check copyright). Also planned for addition are links to N.Y.M.N.P.A and H.D.C Planning application
- 7.3 Cllr T Hill introduced the discussion on revision of the Financial Regulations which he made using the National Association of Local Councils template that had been revised to take account of recent regulatory changes. The Parish Council discussed each substantive change, made a few additional suggestions and the new Parish Council Regulations were agreed and adopted. Cllr T Hill agreed to complete all edits and then add to the website.

8 FAWCETT BUTCHER SHOP – repair of old clock

It was noted that the N.Y.M.N.P.A grants for local Communities became available in April. Cultural Heritage and Local History contributions were also discussed.

9 CLERKS REPORT ON ACTION FROM MEETINGS

9.1 Highway issues update,

Lamb Lane to Ingleby Bank

This was identified to be repaired in the NYCC Highways maintenance programme for 2016/17. However, NYCC have now informed Cllr. H. Moorhouse that because this road has deteriorated so badly, it now needs major reconstruction, and that there are insufficient funds available in this year's programme. The Parish Council expressed great disappointment and reaffirmed their belief that it requires repair asap. It was agreed that a meeting would be held with N.Y.C.C Highways to discuss highways problem in the village including the following other issues:

10. Easby/Kildale Road under Railway bridge underpass

In April there had been serious flooding where the road had to be closed. The Parish Council had received an email informing them that road would be closed for 6hours from 23.00 on the 17th June

Road in Old Battersby village, in the centre of the village it is now in a very bad state of repair, especially road edges.

12 Foot Paths Updates

Ingleby to Manor,

Some work had been completed over the Easter week end more will follow in the Summer by N.Y.M.N.P.A. voluntaries.

13 Church Lane to Manor (unsuitable).

No update received

11.4 Atkinson Wood Farm to Easby

A pretension of photographic report which showed that the path was impossible to walk in several places along the steepest part of the hill behind Oakwood, and up to High Farm. This area falls on the boundary of Ingleby Greenhow and Easby Parishes. Cllr H. Moorhouse took copy of the report and agreed to follow this up with the N.Y.M.N.P.A at the Northern Forum meeting. Also provided was an electronic copy of the photographs and locations.

11.5 Blocked footpath nr Bonnie Hill Farm OS grid ref NZ 5740 0514

This had been reported to the Footpath Officer, no update had been received. Cllr H. Moorhouse agreed to look into this.

12 N.Y.C.C. - re-village and N.Y.M.N.P.A signs

Receipt of N.Y.C.C. "Passive Safety Protocol "re sighting of signs on Highway. Cllr T. Sutcliffe, gave an update he had asked for a meeting with the Transport Manager, to see where the sign would be allowed to go.

13 INGLEBY LANE FARM, INGLEBY GREENHOW

The Parish Council had received an anonymous letter from a Member of the Parish about the new fence at the entrance to Ingleby Lane Farm, the letter was noted and it was agreed that it would be forwarded on to N.Y.C.C. Highways.

Copy of letter of complaint from Mr K. Clark to Mrs P. Johnson (Team Leader Transport & Development Council at Country Hall) was also received and noted. The letter concerned the previous planning application and Highways Access assessment at Ingleby lane Farm.

14 TOWER MINT LTD

- 14.1 It was agreed to give all children living in the Parish, and all those that attend Ingleby Greenhow School, a crown to mark the Queen 90th birthday. Details of children in the Parish had been compiled by the Parish Clerk and following consideration the Parish Council agreed to order 100, with a view to offering any surplus ones for sale.
- 14.2 Battersby Junction Community Association were looking at holding a coffee morning in June. The Councillors felt that this would be a good events to distribute the crowns out.

15 COUNCILLORS REPORTS

It was noted that in dry weather there is water running on to the road from the edge of the driver at The Old Parsonage. Cllr T. Sutcliffe agreed to look into this. At the May Parish Council Annual meeting would look at doing a presentation on the website.

15.2 Tees River Trust

Cllr R. Wills had written on behalf of the Parish Council, who are supporting in respect of the Leven Project, to see if they could help with the restoring of the stepping stones at the beck near St Andrews Church Ingleby Greenhow, as over the years these stone have sunk. Also on Otter Hills Beck as it fall from Battersby Moor, there is a pond frequented by wildfowl and also has is a lovely view across the fields. The Parish Council wondered if the trust would consider placing a bench near the pond.
