## 7.1 Mr Harrison Planning Demblin Easby

It was agreed that a Solicitor would be employed to write to Zeligrate and the Railway Board informing them of the condition of the road. It was also agreed for all households to pay a £50 toward the cost. A further meeting to be held when a response had been received.

The closure was raised with the Police and they agreed to look into this and respond regarding the offence caused by vehicles using a closed road.

#### 7.4 Turkey Nab Road to Farndale

Cllr T. Sutcliffe raised the stated of the road. The Police agreed to look at the road when next on off-road operations. Cllr H. Moorhouse suggested getting the NYMNPA involved. It was felt that NYCC Highway have a duty of care to road users. Highways to be requested to undertake a survey and assessment of the road and also a risk assessment
