Cllr L Smith offers thanks to all Parish Councilors who gave up their time and effort voluntarily for all the work that they provide for the Parish. Thanks to NYC Cllr H Moorhouse dealing with the council requests. Thanks go to the Police for their attendance at the PC meetings, the village hall committee and all other volunteers within the parish who carry out tasks such as maintaining defibrillators, playpark and other origination and running of events.  The Parish Council has held ten meetings in the last year and considered several planning applications. Residents of the parish attend a few of the meetings but overall, very few attend, so I like to take the opportunity to welcome residents to come along to the meetings.  The work continues to reestablish the boundary stones around the parish and the council have re-erected the one on Broughton Road with kind assistance of Cllr T Sutcliffe.  The Parish Council has continued to maintain the verges within us over the past year and recently undertook work to the tree on stone stoup.  There has been a notable amount of fly tipping which occurred in the year.  The defibrillators continue to be uptilted more than we would hope for however this demonstrates just how necessary they have been throughout the parish. The Parish Council funded the replacement of maintenance items thanks to the local guardians of the defibrillators who quickly noted their use during routine checks.  The defibrillators have caused an addition to the budget and along with general cost pressures associated with the operation of the PC we had to make a tough decision to increase the Parish Council precept to continue the delivery of service essential to Parish.  Finally, thanks to the Parish Clerk whose work allows the Parish Council able to function and who has been a great assistant to me throughout the year.</p>
